# 2. Strong Institution - Three universities to enjoy autonomy under new Universities Law — Al-Sheikh

Saudi Arabia's Minister of Education and Chairman of the University Affairs Council (UAC) Dr. Hamad Al-Sheikh said that three premier Saudi universities would have autonomy in the academic, financial, and administrative areas.

"The new Universities Law will apply to King Saud University, King Abdulaziz University, and Imam Abdul Rahman Bin Faisal University in the first phase," he said, while noting that the highest authorities have issued the necessary approval in this regard.

Under the law, the three universities would enjoy disciplined autonomy in framing their academic, financial, and administrative regulations.

They can also formulate their specializations and programs in accordance with the development needs and job opportunities in the regions that come under their jurisdiction, and these shall be in line with the general policies approved by the State through UAC.

Al-Sheikh congratulated the three universities and all their officials for winning this great honor. He wished them success in serving the country and its leadership, as well as in achieving the vision of the country to have transformative development in the Kingdom's university education.

# 4. Strong Institution - Anthology Together Middle East In the category of: Excellence in Community Engagement 2022

Imam Abdulrahman bin Faisal University-Deanship of eLearning, has been named a winner of Excellence in Community Engagement Award 2022 at The Blackboard Teaching & Learning Conference Middle East (TLC ME): Anthology Together Middle East 2022, for launching a project that showcases the development of interactive e-courses on technology-enhanced level while adopting quality standards, and making cost effective informed decisions based on insights from the eLearning Data Intelligence and analytics Dashboard.

Anthology Together Middle East (#ATME22) introduced an expanded agenda, which Dr. Muneerah B. Almahasheer (Dean) of the Deanship of eLearning took part in and presented "Reshaping crafted e-Courses Based-on Anthology Educational Insights to Empower Students' Learning Experience" 18 October 2022

The idea of the current success story expedites the development of eCourses to include 432 e-courses in 9 colleges and18 different academic programs. This project is the anchor of IAU's shift to blended learning best practices, it supports massive enrollment of students, cost savings initiatives, faculty members support, shortage of instructional designers and experienced faculty members.

To ensure the improvement of the learning experience of this promising project, the deanship developed an eLearning Data Intelligence and analytics Dashboard. The IAU eLearning deanship and Anthology/Blackboard teams developed 8 dashboards (with 405 measures, 17 perspectives and 3 data cubes) to enhance courses' design and development and provide insights to take informed decisions for improving teaching and students' engagements and faculty excellence. The insights from data analytics can lead to more informed decisions that can improve our e-courses design and development process, as well as enhance the learning experience for our students and help increase their engagement.

# 5. The University and Eastern Prisons are Considering Developing a Reform Initiative

The president of Imam Abdulrahman Bin Faisal University, Dr. Abdullah Al Rubaish, had a consultive meeting with the Director of Prisons of the Eastern Region, Brigadier General Abdullah Al-Farajan. The meeting included the desire to develop the agreement between the University and the Eastern Prisons, which took shape under the umbrella of the Reform Initiative, represented by the Deanship of Community Service and Sustainable Development on Thursday, 6/02/2020, at the University's headquarters, in the presence of the University's Vice President for Studies, Development and Community Service, Dr. Abdullah Alkadi; Dean of Community Service and Sustainable Development, Dr. Fatma Al-Malham; and Vice Dean Dr. Youssef Al-Rashed.





Dr. Al Rubaish mentioned that the Reform Initiative is one of the University's community service initiatives. This initiative was directed with the Eastern District Prison Directorate to all inmates in Eastern prisons to provide them with many services, including distance education, where a group has graduated at the bachelor's level. This type of study contributes to reformulating the character of the inmate and qualifying him/her for the job market when he/she is released.

Dr. Al Rubaish noted that the services of the Reform Initiative varied through partnerships with various colleges at the University, such as the College of Applied Studies, which offered numerous training courses, the College of Medicine, which conducted detection and therapeutic visits, and the College of Dentistry, provided a range of treatment courses for more than 2,600 inmates. The Deanship of Library Affairs has participated by providing numerous books, which have enriched the Prison's Library with Arabic content. The Prisoner wants to diversify the activities that he can spend his time on through education, reading or sports activities. For this reason, the Preparatory Year Deanship has prepared some sports, leisure and cultural activities for them. The College of Public Health, the College of Education and the College of Sharia and Law have also contributed in numerous activities. In addition, the College of Architecture and Planning has developed some buildings in the Eastern District prisons.

Brigadier General Al-Farajan noted that this initiative is of great importance, especially with a university like Imam Abdulrahman Bin Faisal University, which has shown a desire to reach out and activate this initiative. What we have seen today is encouraging, and we hope to sign a partnership with the university to benefit all prison inmates.

## 7. Research Ethics on Living Creatures

The Imam Abdulrahman Bin Faisal University is committed to provide the required environment for conducting the biological research on human and living creatures safely and effective manner and to ensure the participants rights and prevent exposure to the lowest risk and harm. Deanship of Scientific Research (DSR) reviews and funds the biomedical, behavioral and operational clinical research. In reviewing the research proposals/applications, DSR complies with The Kingdom's regulations governing the protection of human research participants in research and when applicable, guidelines such as the CIOMS International Ethical Guidelines for Biomedical Research Involving Human Subjects and the Helsinki Declaration. We provide our input on the design of these studies, including the handling of regulatory matters.





## 8. Scientific Integrity

As Imam Abdulrahman Bin Faisal University commits to develop an institutional environment of intellectual curiosity and become an internationally competitive site for scientific research and discovery, we also aspire to achieve and maintain the highest standards of research ethics and scientific integrity. The pursuit of these ambitions demands that we develop and follow high ethical standards for scientific study and research that embody these goals and

The following Policy for Scientific Integrity provides a set of framework standards, guidelines, and procedures within which we can assure our maintenance of an environment that promotes such high standards for research ethics and scientific integrity. Included in this Policy are:

- KACST's NSTIP Rules for Scientific Integrity (Part I);
- Additional guidelines relating to Scientific Publications (Part II);
- Policies related to Conflict of Commitment and Conflict of Interest (Part III); and,
- A detailed description of the processes undertaken to evaluate any concerns reported regarding scientific misconduct or conflicts of commitment and conflicts of interest (Part IV).

Although the principles embodied in this policy are not new to IAU, their clarification through this policy is intended to promote a IAU wide understanding of these accepted standards and insure the maintenance of our traditional deep commitment to ethical behaviour and scientific integrity. Our goal is to insure that all institutional members are familiar with this policy; and, thereby, that they become engaged advocates for its adherence.

## 9. Animal Care & Use in Scientific Research

This policy for the care and use of animals in scientific research underscores the commitment to assure the humane treatment of all animals used in research at IAU. We recognize the obligations associated with using other species of living creatures for the purpose of improving the wellbeing of humankind and have developed this policy and its associated guidelines, rules and regulations



with that responsibility in mind. Although only rodents and rabbits are currently used for research purposes at IAU, we have developed this policy with the knowledge and inclusiveness that it can be adopted for use with other species as well. As described in the policy, we also are committed to the three "R's" when using animals for research, which are:

- Restricting animal use in research to circumstances when the objectives of the research otherwise cannot be realized;
- Reduction of the number of animals used in protocols to the minimum required to achieve the aims of the research project; and,
- Refinement of research protocols to minimize pain and stress in animals used in research.

The Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) is tasked to see that these rules are followed in all protocols using animals for scientific research at IAU. We have used internationally accepted guidelines in the development of this policy with the explicit desire to ultimately achieve international accreditation for our programs for care and use of animals in scientific research. Further, the detailed nature of this policy is designed to provide the IACUC, investigator, and the animal care personnel (veterinarian and staff) with the detailed guidelines for compliance with such accrediting agencies. The associated training program attached to this policy will also enhance general knowledge and assure the ethical conduct of all aspects of our animal research program.
