It is the function of the departments of the Deanship of Student Affairs and supervising the food services that are provided on university events and student activities. The administration is keen to ensure that the health care is at a healthy and nutritional level of high quality.

Vision

Leadership in providing food services.

Mission

To provide high-quality, healthy food services to university students and its employees, with catering equipment in line with international standards.

Nutrition management services

- 1. Restaurants: (Male Restaurant Female Restaurant) Three meals are served daily (breakfast lunch dinner) in the university restaurants on weekdays.
- 2. "Cafeterias": follow up the work of "cafeterias" in all university faculties and departments.
- 3. Food services for student activities: The Nutrition Department participates in providing food service to support the success of student activities.

Functions of the Nutrition Department

The Nutrition Department carries out many administrative, supervisory, and awareness-raising tasks in the field of food health, the most important of which are:

Administrative tasks:

- 1. Supervising the necessary procedures to start implementing the subsistence contract.
- 2. Supervising student nutrition services at the university.
- 3. Strive to provide healthy meals of high quality.
- 4. Developing and improving the nutritional services provided to students at the university.
- 5. Benefit from students 'proposals in the field of providing better food service.
- 6. Following up students' problems related to food service and finding solutions to these problems.
- 7. Supervising the process of charging the prepaid smart card for students according to the approved financial systems.

Supervisory functions

- 1. Setting the conditions and specifications for the university's nutrition services and following up on their implementation.
- 2. Supervising the preparation and processing of meals.

- 3. Follow-up of workers working in the kitchen in terms of personal hygiene, and cleanliness of tools.
- 4. Supervising the cleanliness of food halls.
- 5. Supervising the distribution of meals in an appropriate manner.
- 6. Monitoring dry and fresh foodstuffs in terms of validity and quality.
- 7. Following up on "cafeterias" in terms of cleanliness, and the variety of items offered.
- 8. Follow-up to "cafeterias" in terms of adherence to the published prices.
- 9. Following up on the implementation of the conditions of nutrition and lifting the violations.
- 10. Following up the warehouses, knowing the needs, and the demands of the contractors to secure them.

Educational tasks

- 1. Working to spread food awareness by providing awareness and educational pamphlets.
- 2. Providing training courses for students specialized in the field of nutrition.
- 3. Receiving students to visit the restaurant and inform them of food supplies.

Activities, events, and programs that the Nutrition Department participates in.

- 1. Hosting of university employees and students.
- 2. Participation in the National Day ceremony.
- 3. Participate in the university's graduation ceremony.
- 4. Participation in all major activities of the Deanship of Student Affairs.
- 5. Offering the duty of hospitality to the participants in internal sports competitions.
- 6. Providing the duty of hospitality to university visitors.
- 7. Provide the duty of hospitality to participants with special needs in the gym.
- 8. Hosting female students of the Clinical Nutrition Department at the College of Applied Medical Sciences in the university's restaurant as part of the application part of the food services course.
- 9. Participating in providing snacks for teams participating in sports activities for sports gatherings in the Saudi Universities Sports Federation Championship.
- 10. Cooperating with the student clubs within the Deanship's activity (by keeping it lasting), whereby the leftovers and the extra quantity of lunch meals are collected, and the food is wrapped and divided, and then the mobile team distributed those meals to workers and the needy on the campus.
- 11. Hosting delegations of university forums.
- 12. Cooperating with the Itaam Charity Association by collecting leftovers and the extra quantity of meals and distributing them to the needy in the Eastern Region.



All students can access the clinical services available at the University Counseling Center, which are:

Individual Counseling

Psychological Counseling:

We provide individual counseling services to all Imam Abdulrahman bin Faisal University students, faculty members, and employees on a variety of topics, including but not limited to anxiety, depression, stress, conflicts, grief, marriage problems, smoking and addiction problems, and life decision-making.

Academic Counseling:

We provide one-by-one counseling for students who have academic problems. Our staff provides services to help students deal with exam anxiety, educational stress, learning difficulties, learning strategies, developing learning skills, time management, and teamwork skills.

Occupational Counseling:

We apply a range of career orientation scales to help students determine their career orientation. We also provide a career guidance service by discussing with students about their interests related to current and future career orientation programs. The University Counseling Center also cooperates closely with Alumni and Career Development Center.

Group-Counseling

It is a service for individuals with similar interests to support their emotional, behavioral, psychological, and social development. The service may include holding psychological, educational, and methodological sessions that take between 6-8 sessions, where one group includes 2-8 persons.

Psychological Evaluation

The University Counseling Center provides psychological assessment for the abilities and characteristics of the students in the light of highly psychometric tests congruent with the Saudi environment. The tests are programmed electronically so that it is easy to reveal the results of the student after the completion of the assessment. The clinical psychologist also provides a psychological session at the center to discuss the test results to enable students to understand What the evaluation results indicate.

Awareness Services

We make use of every opportunity possible to provide awareness. We are always present at the various events that take place throughout the university. We have expanded the scope of our services by providing the service through 23 units of counseling in the colleges, major headquarters, and other sub-units of the university by using awareness means such as e-messages, flyers, brochures, poster ads, and the screens located throughout the university.

Emergency Cases Intervention

Intervention protocol

An intervention plan is a service provided to a student who suffers severe psychological pressures that may threaten the student's life.

We have a team capable of dealing with emergency cases, such as suicide attempts, threats of suicide, physical abuse, violence, self-harm, trauma, and other forms of such cases.

Those responsible for implementing the protocol deal only with the student, where intervention from any other party in the university is forbidden otherwise, the intervener will be subject to legal liability.

In case of such urgent cases, the student can visit the center or call during official work hours (from Sunday to Thursday, 8:00a.m -2:00p.m) 0133330802 (for males) and 0133330849 (for females).








IAU Counseling Center activated "World Mental Health Day", to be on the 10th of October annually. The center provided several services to students and university employees in the lobby of the health colleges through an exhibition of awareness messages and media articles.

The Director of the Center, Dr. Abeer bint Ali Al-Rasheed, stated that the celebration of this World Day aims to raise awareness with the importance of mental health among individuals, because mental health goes beyond the issue of treating disorders seeking to achieve happiness, psychological well-being, and enjoyment with quality of life. From this point of view and per activating the role of the center as an academic psychological entity, this world day was activated today with an exhibition presents the services provided to the university's employees, including students, faculty members, and employees, including awareness services, tests, whether academic, psychological, or social, beside use of stress levels devices.

Dr. added. Al-Rasheed that when the student has a high awareness of the importance of mental health, will seek the services of the center, which will certainly provide the necessary service in top confidentiality by skilled specialists. Thus, the student quality of life will be raises along with academic performance too.

Dr. Abeer pointed out that "In many of the academic problems facing us, we find the main aspect is psychological, not academic, and more the student has a high awareness of mental health, the more aspects of his life, whether psychological, academic, social or family, will be straightened". This why she sees that mental health is not something to mention it one day per year, but it is an ongoing daily matter that deserves attention and follow-up. Adding that we must strengthen this day so that individuals are encouraged to seek the services of the center, as many of them are reluctant to do so believing that the center is only intended for those with severe mental disorder, and this perception is not true. The center provides psychological services at all levels, and for all students, university employees and their families. We wish everyone a good and to make use of the services provided by the center.

Al-Rasheed also explained that the center holds many interactive workshops and training courses to students where beneficiaries has reached large numbers that exceeded thousands. The center activities included workshops about smoking where the collective counseling became a contributor and motivator for them to get rid of this reprehensible behavioral habit.

Dr. Abeer Rashid praised the great role played by the Student Council of each college, as they were informed of the services provided, such as tests, measurements, and a relaxation chair. They transferred the services of the center to their colleagues in Rakah campus as well as in female students' departments at the University's branch in Al Rayyan.

Primary Health Care Clinic

The Primary Health Care Clinic was established in the Department of Family and Community Medicine in 1982 with the intent of training medical students, doctors and graduate students in the field of primary health care. 
About Us



Obstetrics and Gynecology Department

The Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology was established in 1981 and is involved in the teaching and training of undergraduate and postgraduate medical students as well as providing routine and tertiary care for all patients. The Department is equipped with a full-fledged delivery room suite that includes first stage rooms, labor rooms and an operating theatre for obstetric cases. The hospital receives normal and high-risk cases through different channels. There are 12 Obstetrics and Gynecology clinics per week. Consultants, senior registrars and residents are involved in the running of these clinics. The Department runs an active Obstetrics and Gynecology emergency room, providing around-the-clock service. In adition to training the medical students from IAU's own College of Medicine, the Department regularly trains interns and resident doctors from the Department of Family Medicine, the community and students of the Faculty of Nursing, Imam Abdulrahman Bin Faisal University as well as training graduate students enrolled in the fellowship program of the Saudi Board as well as the fellowship of the Council of Arab Medical Specialties in the specialty of obstetrics and gynecology.

The Department encourages its staff to conduct, write, present and publish their research within the Kingdom and abroad.

Under the patronage of His Excellency the President of Imam Abdulrahman bin Faisal University, Prof. Abdullah bin Muhammad Al-Rubaish, King Fahad Hospital of the University (KFHU) organized a breast cancer awareness campaign entitled "Your awareness protects .. your examination prevents" at Khobar City Walk. It was arranged by the Hospital's Surgery Department, in cooperation with the Health Awareness Unit, the Family and Community Medicine Department, the Medical Laboratory Department, and the Radiology Department. The campaign was launched by the hospital Director General, Prof. Muhammad Al-Shahrani, on Friday, October 27, 2023, and it was attended by the Director of Medical Services at the hospital, Dr. Majid Al-Abdali, the Director General of the Public Relations and Media, Dr. Tufail Al-Yousef, the Head of the breast cancer awareness campaign, Dr. Iman Al-Shammari, and a group of departments Heads and employees of the University Hospital in Al-Khobar.

Dr. Al-Shahrani stressed on the importance of October as it is the breast cancer awareness month worldwide, and he added that international studies have proven that breast cancer is the most common cancer among females around the world, and in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia the number

of women suffering from breast cancer makes it occupy the first place among other types of cancers. From this standpoint, we work at KFHU, in cooperation with community agencies, to implement many activities and events that aim at encouraging women to undergo mammogram breast cancer screening to be able to detect tumors at early stages before the appearance of the symptoms and to provide all the necessary support to raise awareness of its danger.

For her part, Dr. Iman Al-Shammari explained that the annual breast cancer early detection campaign, launched this year with the slogan "Your awareness protects .. your examination prevents," stressed on the importance of spreading community awareness of breast cancer early detection in the Eastern province. Thus, the awareness campaign included educational booths arranged with the participation of several departments from KFHU as well as the Family and Community Medicine Center with the participation of 50 doctors, and several volunteers.

They introduced the elements that can reduce the incidence of breast cancer and prevent it and they also introduced facts about early detection of breast cancer, and its importance in helping to treat the disease and deal with it, in addition to providing a mammogram screening car for women. We work in cooperation with all the departments in the hospitals on early detection with the mammogram and the cases that were discovered from the Center for Family and Community Medicine or in the university hospital clinics during this year reached around 300 cases of cancerous tumors, excluding benign tumors which are followed up with a treatment plan and an annual follow up in cooperation with the Department of Surgery and the Center for Family and Community Medicine. Finally, Dr. Al-Shammari mentioned that they received 500 cases for mammogram breast cancer screening during this October.

The College Vice-dean for Development and Community Partnership opened the Breast Cancer Awareness Exhibition in the Blue Hall of the College of Sciences and Humanities, Jubail, on Tuesday, 4/9/1445, corresponding to October 24, 2023.

The exhibition was supervised by the Community Service Unit and in cooperation with the academic departments of the college. The exhibition included intellectual corners and free consultations by specialists in the field from Jubail General Hospital and the Royal Commission Hospital in Jubail that answered visitors' questions and raise their awareness of the necessity of breast cancer screening. The specialists also provided enriching advises about breast cancer.

Moreover, the exhibition hosted an expert nutritionist to speak and educate visitors about the relationship between food and disease in three stages: prevention stage, treatment stage, post-treatment stage and recovery. Healthy freebies, such as nuts and antioxidant fruits, were given to the audience in the right quantities. The exhibition presented statistical questionnaires, enriching information, and a visual nutrition corner for visitors by displaying plastic paintings about the campaign with the participation of the Jubail GESFT Association.

On the sidelines of the exhibition, the Women in Health volunteer team, in cooperation with the Mathematics Department, participated in the walking marathon to enhance awareness about the importance of following healthy lifestyles.

Free Sexual & Reproductive Health Care Services for Students

PURPOSES:

- 2.1 For students to succeed academically, it is crucial that they have access to the resources, care, and guidance they need to look after their sexual and reproductive health.
- 2.2 IAU acknowledges that administration, staff, and students all have responsibility for protecting reproductive health of the students, staff and their families, and various workshops, events etc. should be organized to create awareness amongst the students, staff and community.
- 2.3 All the services informational, educational, emergency, consultancy etc. should be provided free of cost by the university volunteers.

DEFINITION:

- 3.1 **Reproductive health** refers to a condition of physical, mental, and social wellbeing and not only the absence of disease or infirmity.
- **3.2 Sexual health** refers to a state of physical, emotional, mental and social wellbeing; it is not merely the absence of disease, dysfunction or infirmity.

POLICY:

- 4.1 An affiliate hospital, the King Fahd Hospital of the University (KFHU), will provide all students, and staff with expert, sympathetic, and supportive care in line with the IAU's mission.
- 4.2 IAU will ensure that the medical staff at KFHU is dedicated to treating each student as a whole and offering them services for their reproductive health as well as medical advice.
- 4.3 In the course of an appointment, IAU students are encouraged to address their requirements, queries, and worries.
- 4.5 IAU and KFHU follow the rules of the Kingdom to safeguard a student's right to privacy.
- 4.6 All health services are confidential. All conversations are held in the strictest of confidence provided with support and without judgment.

- 4.7 Student's information is safe with IAU, and it will not be shared with anyone outside of the IAU community without the student's permission.
- 4.8 IAU & its affiliate provide comprehensive health services for sexual and reproductive health screenings which includes:
 - 4.8.1 Breast exams
 - 4.8.2 HIV screening / referral
 - 4.8.3 HPV vaccine
 - 4.8.4 Pregnancy testing / referral
 - 4.8.5 STI screening / treatment
 - 4.8.6 Well male & female (Pap) exams
- 4.9 At IAU, all medical records are private and confidential. They can only be transmitted to another institution upon the student's request and with a signed written release form sent to be sent to its affiliate hospital (KFHU).
- 4.10 IAU's policy is to respect students' right to privacy and will never divulge any information without proper authorization to anyone, including parents, friends, or teaching staff.

PROCEDURE:

- 5.1 IAU health services must be accessible to all students without requiring them to travel over a significant distance or for an extended period of time, and they must also offer information and services on prevention, diagnosis, counseling, treatment, and care.
- 5.2 All enrolled IAU students have access to a range of sexual and reproductive health services through IAU Student Health.
- 5.3 IAU Student Health Services will offer a wide range of preventative services through its affiliated hospital, including education, counseling, testing, and treatment for specific diseases as well as broad preventive measures including history taking and risk assessment.
- 5.4 IAU provide immediate and lifelong health by identifying health issues early and providing services.
- 5.4 IAU with its affiliate hospital will ensure that health issues are caught early to enable effective treatment.
- 5.5 IAU will make sure that every student has access to the student health services.
- 5.6 All IAU employees and their families have free access to all the health service provided by the university health center

Primary Health Care Clinic

The Primary Health Care Clinic was established in the Department of Family and Community Medicine in 1982 with the intent of training medical students, doctors and graduate students in the field of primary health care. The Clinic has become a center for business and research activities for graduate students enrolled in the Family Medicine and Community Health fellowship program and is the first of its kind.

In addition to providing training opportunities, this center provides comprehensive health care services that focus on the maternal and child health area. The clinic has 15 doctors on staff and is equipped with the latest equipment for study and research.

Private Clinic

This clinic is dedicated to providing treatment and medical care to the employees of the Palace of His Royal Highness, the Emir of the Eastern Province as well as the Palace of His Highness, the Deputy Emir of the Eastern Province. There are two doctors dedicated to this clinic along with one nurse.


About Us

The Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology was established in 1981 and is involved in the teaching and training of undergraduate and postgraduate medical students as well as providing routine and tertiary care for all patients. The Department is equipped with a full-fledged delivery room suite that includes first stage rooms, labor rooms and an operating theatre for obstetric cases. The hospital receives normal and high-risk cases through different channels. There are 12 Obstetrics

and Gynecology clinics per week. Consultants, senior registrars and residents are involved in the running of these clinics. The Department runs an active Obstetrics and Gynecology emergency room, providing around-the-clock service. In adition to training the medical students from IAU's own College of Medicine, the Department regularly trains interns and resident doctors from the Department of Family Medicine, the community and students of the Faculty of Nursing, Imam Abdulrahman Bin Faisal University as well as training graduate students enrolled in the fellowship program of the Saudi Board as well as the fellowship of the Council of Arab Medical Specialties in the specialty of obstetrics and gynecology.

The Department encourages its staff to conduct, write, present and publish their research within the Kingdom and abroad.

3- Gym (gymnasium)

It contains (2) halls including (1) hall (five-a-side football - handball - basketball - volleyball) with public attendance and (1) hall (basketball - volleyball) in addition to recreational games, minifootball, hockey, and billiards, as well as a hall Table tennis for (3) tables.

4- Squash hall

It contains (3) squash courts.

5- Fitness hall

It includes the latest sports equipment and tools for strength and fitness training

6- Bowling hall

It includes the latest sports equipment and tools for strength and fitness training

7- The sports pool

A 25m swimming pool is closed and heated, and is used for swimming for university employees and students (free activity)

8- Al Fahad Stadium

An international certified football field contains (one football field - two five football fields)

9- Cheetah gym

It contains (1) comprehensive hall (five-a-side football - handball - basketball - volleyball) - fitness hall.
